

McAlpine Creek & Campbell Creek Greenway

Paved & Gravel Greenway = 4.08 Miles

Entrances = 1.72 Miles

Cottonwood Nature Trail = 1.5 Miles

McAlpine Cross Country = 5k or 3.1 Miles

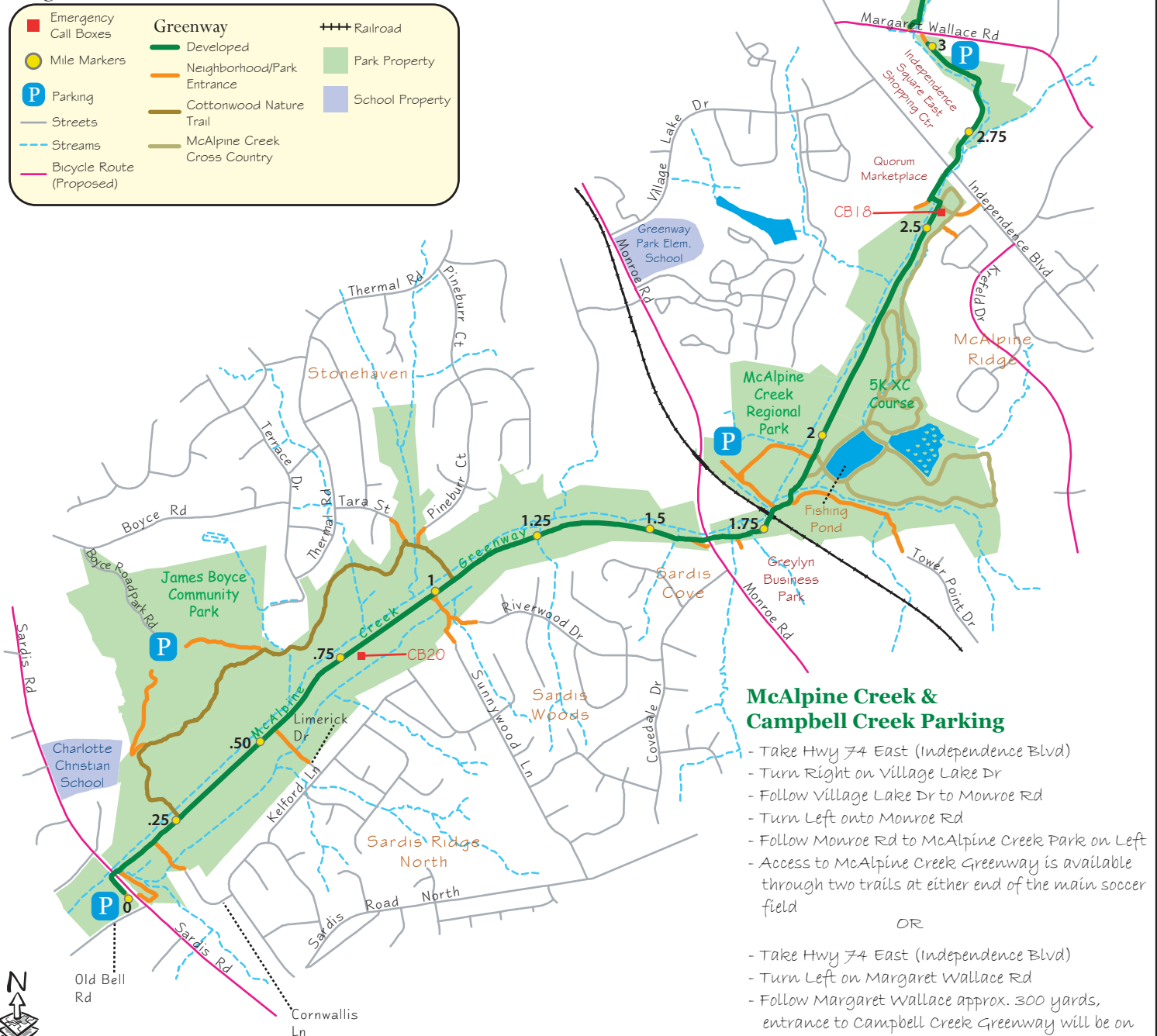
Items of Interest:

Though surrounded by urban development, McAlpine Creek Greenway and Community Park are the only greenway/park combination where you can see river otter, beaver, and mink all in one general area. Also protected at this greenway is Mecklenburg County's only population of a native larkspur (*Delphinium tricornne*), a very rare, showy, purple, spring ephemeral wildflower.

188 species of birds have been documented along McAlpine Creek Greenway, the second highest site total in Mecklenburg County.

McAlpine Creek & Campbell Creek Parking

- Take Hwy 74 East (Independence Blvd)
- Turn Right on Village Lake Dr
- Follow Village Lake Dr to Monroe Rd
- Turn Left onto Monroe Rd
- Follow Monroe Rd to McAlpine Creek Park on Left
- Access to McAlpine Creek Greenway is available through two trails at either end of the main soccer field

OR

- Take Hwy 74 East (Independence Blvd)
- Turn Left on Margaret Wallace Rd
- Follow Margaret Wallace approx. 300 yards, entrance to Campbell Creek Greenway will be on the Right across the street from a fire station
- Parking is available in a gravel lot
